INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

The Argus Mid-Cap Strategy objective is to deliver superior returns compared to the S&P 500 on a risk-adjusted basis over the long term.

The Mid-Cap Strategy may be appropriate for investors who:

- Seek capital returns from their portfolio, with current income as a secondary concern
- Have a relatively high risk tolerance for market volatility
- Possess a long-term investment horizon, encompassing the full market and economic cycle

PORTFOLIO STRATEGY

INCEPTION DATE: 3/31/2025

The Argus Mid-Cap Strategy is a focused portfolio of 25–35 stocks that are BUY rated by Argus’s team of Research Analysts. At the time of section, all stocks must fall within the market capitalization range of the S&P 400 Mid-Cap Index.

Argus builds the Mid-Cap Strategy using a top-down, fundamentals-based approach focused on:

- **Growth & Profitability:** Stocks with high returns on capital, with a minimum ROE target of 20%, as well as stocks for which analysts are raising EPS estimates.
- **Financial Strength:** Stocks of companies judged by Argus analysts to have strong balance sheets and tend to have healthy debt/capitalization ratios.
- **Valuation:** Stocks that have an earnings yield higher than corporate bond yields, as well as stocks that offer a dividend.
- **Risk Management:** The portfolio holds at least 25 stocks from at least 8 sectors; stock weights 2-5%.
